			continue to make excellent progress in PE and
			develop the skills they need in order for them to
			be physically and mentally healthy.
			Due to losing significant amounts of PE
			equipment when the school was flooded in
			September 2023, working with Tyrell Sports has
			ensured that the school has the specialist

equipment needed to run a high quality sports
curriculum.
Our pupils have expressed their enjoyment of our
PE lessons and can confidently talk about the
skills they have learnt, the importance of being
active and staying healthy and their love of PE.

Swimming with Dawlish Leisure Centre	£540	Whole of Key Stage 2	72% of Years 3 & 4 can successfully swim 25 meters or more. 86% of Years 5 & 6 can successfully swim 25 meters or more.
			The number of pupils who can swim 25 meters or more has increased greatly this year and all of our Year 6 pupils are meeting the national curriculum swimming requirements before moving onto secondary school. The overall quality of teaching in our swimming lessons this year was excellent and school staff reported that the curriculum delivered by Dawlish Leisure Centre was incredibly thorough. After speaking with our pupils it was evident that they had all enjoyed themselves and found these sessions beneficial. All of our pupils reported that their confidence in

			their ability to swim had increased and they had a greater understanding of water safety. Moving forward we will ensure that those from Years 3 & 4 who cannot swim the 25 meters or more
			requirement will be given additional opportunities to develop their swimming ability and confidence.
Dance with Katie	£2,735	Whole School Participation	Introducing a permanent fixture of specialist dance teaching in our PE curriculum has been incredibly beneficial to all of our pupils. We have noticed an increased participation from our male pupils in all arts areas, particularly drama and dance, and have been informed that a number of our pupils, both male and female, have either joined or enquired into dance lessons and clubs outside of school. 100% of children have performed a dance in front of an audience this year. The school has invested in a high quality production of Matilda this year and the children will be performing complex choreography on a full stage. Our dance provision has also supported our wider

		Participation	this year has been an excellent extension to our PE curriculum as our pupils have been given several opportunities to develop both their

physical and mental wellbeing. After taking part in
these sessions we noticed that the physical
stamina and endurance of pupils developed
greatly as they were given the room and space to
improve their gross motor skills, fine motor skills
and spatial awareness. With the activities on offer
in our forest school lessons this year our pupils
have not only developed their physical health,
they have also *** their understanding of how to
deal with their emotions and also developing life
skills such as trust, respect, teamwork and
communication.

Dartmoor School Sports Partnership with Jack	£4,800	Whole School Participation	Our rich and varied calendar of events from the DSS Partnership has provided all of our pupils with multiple opportunities to explore and try out new sports. Feedback from our parents and pupils highlight that our pupils have thoroughly enjoyed taking part in competitive sports and that a number of our pupils have either joined or looking into joining competitive teams outside of school. Our teachers have also noticed that the variety of sports and competitions available to our pupils has developed their confidence greatly and has encourage them to step out of their comfort one and try new things. 100% of children have taken part in impact days.

Continuing our work with the DSSP for another year will enable our pupils to experience a wider range of sports and competitive environments that
will enhance their enthusiasm and participation in PE.
